

Do you know when to review your Will?'

- Is your Will less than 10 years old?
- Is your executor up to date and still able to carry out their duties?
- Do you have the most recent copy of your Will?
- Are all pre-existing older Wills destroyed?
- Do you have a Will?

More than 60% of Australians don't have a Will.



Of the 40% that do, many do not regularly update it to reflect their wishes.

When should you be reviewing your Will?

Change of beneficiaries – has a beneficiary passed? Charity closed?
Have you recently bought or sold assets? Home, car, jewellery?
Have you recently gotten married, separated, divorced?
Have you considered what will happen to your pet if they outlive you?
Have you started or ended a de-facto relationship?
Has there been a birth of a new family member, child / grandchild?
Have you started / stopped supporting a charity?

It is recommended that you review your Will every 2-3 years. Always seek legal advice to ensure all of your wishes are covered.
